Regarding https://pages.nist.gov/800-63-4/sp800-63b.html#passwordver:

"If Unicode characters are accepted in passwords, the verifier SHOULD apply the normalization process for stabilized strings using either the NFKC or NFKD normalization defined in Sec. 12.1 of Unicode Normalization Forms [UAX15]."

Please note this contradicts RFC-8265, section 4.2.2 (https://www.rfc-editor.org/rfc/rfc8265#section-4.2.2):

"4. Normalization Rule: Unicode Normalization Form C (NFC) MUST be applied to all strings."

I think NIST should consider this issue and update sp800-63b, at least with a note explaining your choice if you don't change to match RFC-8265. (If your experts believe the RFC is wrong, please submit an errata to it.)
